


Online hiring in Banking and Finance registers 30 percent Y-o-Y growth- Monster Employment Index

- Monster Employment Index India registers a 17 percent y-o-y growth
- Education continues to chart long-term Y-o-Y growth of 68 per cent in August
- Customer Service followed by Health Care professionals is the most indemand job role
- IT witnessed a 7-point dip with an Y-o-Y growth of 44 per cent in August as opposed to a Y-o-Y figure of 51 per cent in July

New Delhi, 07 September, 2016: Online recruitment activities in the month of September registered a y-oy growth of 17 percent, according to the latest Monster Employment Index. The banking and finance sector (BFSI) which is currently undergoing series of reforms, has shown a positive online hiring trend this month with a Y-o-Y growth figure of 30 percent. The Education sector continues to chart a long-term growth owing to special impetus by the government since the budget of 2016.

At the occupational level, online demand for customer services professionals and healthcare professionals suggested improved Y-o-Y growth numbers of 46 per cent and 38 per cent respectively. Citywise data paints a positive picture for tier-II cities as Chandigarh (up by 36 per cent), Jaipur (up by 34 per cent) and Coimbatore (up by 29 per cent) show an uptrend in the Y-o-Y growth chart.

Commenting on the trends, Sanjay Modi, Managing Director, Monster.com, APAC & Middle-East said, "The month



has been challenging in terms of job opportunities for the Indian market owing to a continued slump in usual employment generating sectors - IT and Production & manufacturing. However, BFSI was able to hold its ground in this bearish atmosphere as the sector has been going through a complete metamorphosis. According to our MEI, the BFSI sector registered a 13 points jump since last month with a Y-o-Y growth of 30 per cent. Ongoing digitization in the banking sector and consolidation in the insurance sector has significantly contributed towards job creations for the skilled talent. Among sectors, Production and Manufacturing recorded the steepest Y-o-Y decline of 14 per cent. The growth optimism around the sector persists, a recent survey by FICCI on the manufacturing sector suggests an improvement in growth for the second quarter of the fiscal (July-September 2016-17), with a slightly better outlook for production."

He further added, "Tier-II markets continue to outperform the metros. Chandigarh, Jaipur and Coimbatore are leading with impressive growth figures of 36 per cent, 34 per cent and 29 per cent respectively, whereas metros like Delhi (up by 15 per cent), Bengaluru (up by 26 per cent), and Chennai

(up by 15 per cent), have shown the lowest growth this month. Largely, the Indian job market is steadily moving conducive ecosystem for the employable Indian masses."

Industry Year-over-year Trends: Of the 27 industry sector monitored by the Index 17 industries registered a positive growth year-on-year

- **Education** (up 68 percent) continues to lead the year-on-year growth chart but at a slower pace visà-vis July 2016 (up 74 percent). E-recruitment activity in the sector eased six percent on the month
- The pace of growth year-on-year improved further in BPO/ITES sector; up from 33 percent in July 2016 to 46 percent in August 2016. IT Hardware, Software, on the other hand, saw the growth momentum ease marginally from 51 percent in July 2016 to 44 percent in August 2016
- The annual growth momentum in **Banking/ Financial Services, Insurance** sector improved 13 points; up from 17 percent in July 2016 to 30 percent in August 2016. The sector also recorded the steepest month-on-month growth among all monitored industry sectors; up by 11 percent
- Online recruitment activity in Manufacturing and Commerce slowed significantly this month. Online recruitment activity in Production and Manufacturing plunged 14 percent below the year-ago level. This is also the steepest decline recorded among all monitored industry sectors. Logistic, Courier/ Freight/ Transportation (up nine percent) and Automotive/ Ancillaries / Tyres (up 12 percent) continued to chart an uptrend in hiring activity (year-on-year) but at an eased-up pace

E-Commerce: E-commerce sector registered a 19 percent growth from the year ago; seven points lower than July 2016. This is the least growth recorded in the series. Month-on-month hiring activity eased two percent

<u>Occupation Year-over-year Trends:</u> Online demand exceeded the year-ago level in 12 occupation groups out of the 13 monitored by the Index.

- **Customer service** (up 46 percent) supplanted **Health Care** (up 38 percent) on an annual basis. Customer Service professionals also saw the steepest growth in demand on the month while demand for Heath Care professionals eased one percent between July and August 2016
- Demand at the **Senior Management** level continues to be high; up by 27 percent year-on-year. It is notable, however, that in the past months the growth momentum has dropped progressively
- The annual growth momentum for **Engineering /Production** professionals moderated further; down from 30 percent in July 2016 to 12 percent in August 2016. The group also registered the most notable decline month-on-month; down seven percent
- Online demand for Purchase/ Logistics/ Supply Chain (up two percent) and Hospitality & Travel (up one percent) rebounded following low levels in June and July
- Online demand for **Arts/Creative** continues to be low. The year-on-year growth rate slipped two percent below August 2015; this is the only group to register a downtrend this month in terms of the annual rate of growth

Geographic year-over-year Trends: E-recruitment activity increased in 12 of the all 13 cities monitored by the Index.

- Tier II cities led the long-term growth chart even this month. **Chandigarh** (up 36 percent) followed by **Jaipur** (up 34 percent) and **Coimbatore** (up 29 percent) registered the steepest growth. The pace of growth increased one point in Chandigarh between July and August. Jaipur and Coimbatore, on the other hand, saw growth momentum ease by two point and three point respectively
- **Bangalore** registered a 26 percent growth from the year-ago; same as in July 2016. Bangalore among major cities is the only one to make it among the top five. Nevertheless, the pace of employment growth has slowed considerably in Bangalore in the past three months
- **Delhi-NCR** (up 15 percent); **Hyderabad** (up 19 percent); **Chennai** (up 15 percent) continued to chart double-digit annual growth rate but at a further diminished pace. In **Mumbai** the growth rate remained stable at 18 percent
- Baroda (down four percent) witnessed the second successive year-on-year decline
